- the Czech Republic is situated in the heart of Europe

- the climate of the country is mild and typical of Central Europe with 4 seasons
- the average temperature in winter is 3°C (37 F), in summer are around 23 °C (74 F)

TIME DIFFERENCE

- the Central European Time (CET = GMT + 1) is valid in the Czech Republic
- from the end of March until the end of October the he summer time is set (CEST = GMT+2)

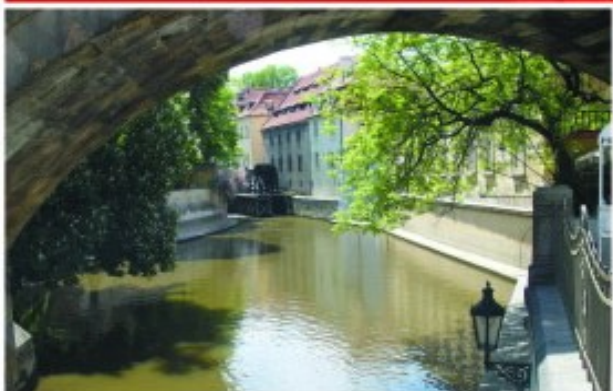

SOME INTERESTING FACTS

- a modern city but equally an architectural treasure trove with more than 1000 years of history and culture
- area of more than 8 sq km in the historical centre registered in the UNESCO World Cultural and Natural Heritage Register
- more than 100 personalities famous world-wide (Charles IV, Rudolf II, J. A. Comenius, Franz Kafka...)
- a place with a pulsating cultural life – more than 2 200 historical buildings, more than 100 theatres, concert halls, picture galleries and museums
- more than 10 000 local and international artists
- EU rewarded Prague as the “European City of Culture in 2000”



SOME INTERESTING FACTS

- **Prague, the capital of the Czech Republic is located in Central Bohemia**
- **Area: 496 sq km**
- **Population: 1 173 000 inhabitants**
- **Waters: the Vltava river flows through the city in the length of 30 km**

- **Prague has maintained its exceptional attractions for tourists and is renowned for being one of the world's most beautiful cities. Almost one-half of the national income from tourism and conventions takes place on its territory.**

- **The city offers approximately 66 000 beds in accommodation facilities, most of which were built after 1990, including almost 54 000 beds in hotels capable of satisfying all categories of visitors. The number of highest-category hotel beds exceeded 26 000 in 2000.**

- **According to the ICCA statistics for 2004 Prague occupied worldwide the rank No. 6 in estimated total number of participants at international meetings.**

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Prague network of public transport routes includes bus, tram and underground links with integrated and harmonized timetables.

UNDERGROUND - METRO

- consists of 3 lines marked by different colours (green line – A, yellow – B, red line – C)
- the overall number of metro stops is 54 out of which 3 are cross points
- it operates from 5 am until midnight, time intervals in the peak hours of work days are 2 to 4 minutes, in the off-peak hours 4 to 10 minutes

TRAMS

- operate daily between 4:30 am and 00:15 am, there is night tram service as well

BUS SERVICES

- run all day as at night on a similar basis to the tram services

TAXI SERVICE

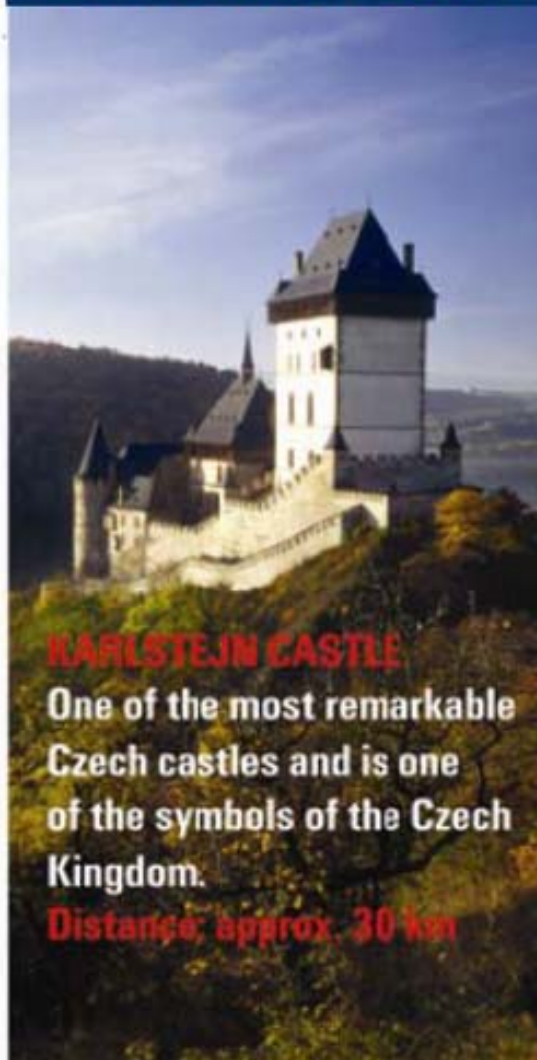
- available round the clock
- it is recommended using only taxi services which are operated via call centers.

KARLSTEJN CASTLE

One of the most remarkable Czech castles and is one of the symbols of the Czech Kingdom.

Distance: approx. 30 km



GRAND TOUR OF PRAGUE

Learn about Prague's history, as well as many of the highlights that Prague has to offer. Walk through Hradšany, the city around famous Prague Castle, the castle itself as well as St. Vitus Cathedral all founded in the 10th century.

Time: approx. 2 hours

- There is more to the Czech Republic than just Prague! The country's smaller towns have plenty to offer to their visitors, who will be impressed by their well-preserved historical centres and carefully maintained monuments whose importance often transcends regional borders.
- Some of these towns were declared urban monument reservations or even included on the UNESCO list of world cultural heritage.

IDEAL FULL DAY TOURS



KARLOVY VARY

The largest and liveliest spa town in the Czech Republic, beautifully situated in the Tepla river valley. Visitors of all ages stroll along the riverside promenade sipping the waters from the twelve curative springs and nibbling on the delicious round spa wafers.

Distance: approx. 130 km



ČESKÝ KRUMLOV

The most beautiful of the Southern Bohemia's quaint towns, boasting the second-largest castle complex in the Czech Republic, a unique Baroque theater and picturesque medieval town centre with cobblestone streets is another of the UNESCO world cultural heritage sites.

Distance: approx. 180 km
(2 day trip highly recommended)
